- a. Oxbow Meadows Environmental Learning Center Ms. Victoria Neundurfer briefed services offered by the Center. - c. Columbus Museum Ms. Kristen Hudson briefed services the Columbus Museum offers. American art and history are displayed for the Chattahoochee Valley Region, It is one of the largest museums in the Southeast. It displays American art and history for the Chattahoochee Valley Region and hosts the Bradley Olmsted Garden, designed by famed architect Frederick Law Olmsted. The museum is a partner with the Muscogee County School District to educate and inspire with various exhibitions and programs. The museum is located on Wynnton Road in Midtown Columbus and offers free admission Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday 1000 1700, Thursday 000 2000, and Sunday 1300 1500. Qualified Recycling Program Mr. Nathan Shuler briefed that the Fort Benning Qualified Recycling Program (QRP) includes predominately recycling of brass and ammunition cans from ranges on Fort Benning. This is the primary revenue for the program. Additionally, they recycle pallets, traditional plastics, paper, cans, and cardboard. Primary collection points are located at the Commissary behind the MWR Car Wash and at the Material Recovery Facility on Jamestown Road. The revenue generated from the QRP goes to projects on Fort Benning. Fort Benning Recycling Program plans investment in personnel staffing, equipment, and green initiatives, upcoming projects and increased marketing and education across the installation. Some expansion projects on the horizon include in-building services for paper, on-installation and surrounding community partnership, and additional collection trailers by February 2022.
