



Oktoberfest in Munich is the largest festival in the world, with an international flavor characteristic of the 20th century. In 2019, Munich will celebrate its 186th Oktoberfest, September 21 through October 6.

People frequently ask, why is Oktoberfest called "Oktoberfest" when it begins in September? And what is its historical background?

The first Oktoberfest was held in 1810 in honor of the Bavarian Crown Prince Ludwig's marriage to Princess Therese von Sachsen-Hildburghausen. The festivities began on October 12, 1810 and ended on October 17 with a horse race. In the following years, the celebrations were repeated and, later, the festival was extended and moved to September.

By moving the festivities up, it allowed for better weather conditions. September nights were warmer, allowing visitors to enjoy the gardens outside the tents and stroll over "die Wiesen" or "the fields" much longer without feeling chilly. Historically, the last Oktoberfest weekend was in October and this tradition continues into present times.

At Fort Benning, we follow suit and wait for better weather conditions. In the South, it can be HOT in September, too hot to enjoy your beer (or two or three) in the Biergarten.


We have it all! German bands, German food and most importantly, German Beer! **THE REAL GERMAN BEER!**

LETTER FROM DIRECTOR



We're just wrapping up another busy PCS season and if you are new to Fort Benning I'd like to welcome you! I believe Fort Benning is a great duty station and most folks agree with me. Whether this is your first time at Benning or second or third, I think you'll find that Fort Benning is always growing and improving. One area in which we have improved over the last few years is in recycling and becoming better stewards of our land and

A few years ago, the Fort Benning Qualified Recycling Program, known as QRP, was formalized as a Garrison Program, managed by a board of directors composed of representatives from the Logistics Readiness Center. MWR, the Directorate of Public Works and the Resource Management Office. The Garrison Commander's office has overall authority; however, MWR is the lead agency in overall management of the program. Now that you know who all is involved, I'd like to explain a little about the program.

The QRP recycles paper, plastics, cardboard, aluminum cans and pallets, and various other scrap metal. It also recycles expended brass cartridges from the ranges. Income from recycling helps to support various projects on the installation that fall under pollution abatement, energy conservation and occupational health and safety. In the last seven years, the program pumped nearly 6.5 million dollars into these projects.

Additionally, recycling income helps support MWR programs, which is why we are involved.

Recycling these materials is the responsible thing to do for our environment and I'm proud Fort Benning is doing its part. By diverting thousands of tons of waste from landfills, we help to extend their useful life and save the installation millions of dollars in landfill tipping fees. The program needs your support and you can help in the following ways:

- Place your recyclable materials in recycling containers near you. The QRP team has strategically placed recycling containers in buildings and various other locations throughout the installation. Some containers are specified for certain type recyclable materials and some are for all types of recyclable material. The large blue 8-yard containers around the installation can accept all types of recyclable materials.
- · Do not place non-recyclable materials in or around the recycling containers. This includes styrofoam, liquids, food and food contaminated items, plastic film (bags, tarps, and shrink wrap), tires, mattresses and furniture. Placing these materials in a container incurs the QRP a fee, causes contaminated material to be thrown away along with other recyclable material that was contaminated in the process.

The Villages of Benning offers curbside pick-up of bulk items such as mattresses and furniture. Pick-up times coincide with your scheduled trash pick-up days, with the exception of McGraw which occurs on Mondays. Bulk pick-up does not accept tires, paint, oil or gas cans.

For information on how to get involved or get answers to questions you may have, stop by the Material Recycling Facility (MRF) located at Building M0298 on Jamestown Road, or call 706-544-9870. The MRF accepts recyclable items Monday through Friday 8am - 2:30pm.

RICHARD ZALER Chief, Army Community Service

Fort Benning's Army Community Service (ACS) has a new Director, Richard Zaler. Zaler comes to Fort Benning from Korea, but has served in duty stations around the world, serving as both active duty and in civil service with two branches of the military.

Born into a military family on an Air Force base in Kansas City, Missouri, Zaler claims KC as his home town although the base is closed.

Having begun his long career of serving the military in 1979 in the Navy building underwater mines, Zaler soon moved into a totally different career in mental health services by joining the Air Force in 2001. He hung up his active duty hat in 2008 switching to civil service. In 2016, he came to work for the Army and MWR in Korea. "In a short period of time I was enamored with the services we provide at ACS and made a major career change at the 22 year mark," said Zaler. "I plan to finish my time with the Army. "

When asked what he likes about Fort Benning's ACS, Zaler

says he absolutely loves working in an organization that helps in so many ways. "We can assist family members with special needs, can assist with emergency loans or grants, and so much more. I had a sample of ACS in Korea but at Benning there are so many more moving parts and this is just an incredible experience. In fact, 52% of the Army comes through Fort Benning. That is astounding and we have the opportunity to show all these Soldiers and Families what world class service at ACS looks like."

Outside of work, Zaler and his wife enjoy travelling and eating exotic food. They have four grown children and two dogs - a 13 year old cranky pug and a 4 year old German Shepherd who tolerates the pug. To decompress, Zaler enjoys long rides on his motorcycle - a Harley Davidson Street Glide.

WHAT IS THE SOLDIER'S **ROLE IN BOSS?**

Without Soldiers, there is no BOSS program. Every company, battalion, regiment and brigade will have a primary and alternate representative on orders for this additional duty. These Soldiers should be highly motivated with leadership potential and willingness to work for their fellow Soldiers. In addition, every company in each major subordinate command, will have a primary and alternate company representative. Representatives act as liaisons, passing information to the Soldier and relaying questions, comments and concerns from the Soldier to BOSS Council members and the chain of command.

WHAT DOES BOSS DO?

Every Army installation is authorized a BOSS program, with a president, representatives from each major subordinate command, a senior military advisor (usually the post or garrison Sergeant Major) and and advisor from MWR, who assists with financial planning, marketing and guidance.

COMMUNITY SERVICES



Did you know, in the United States, a woman is physically assaulted in her home every 15 seconds and one in four women will experience domestic violence? Did you know that children who witness violence are more likely to believe violence is an acceptable way to handle problems and 60 percent of children from violent homes become abusive adults? In fact, a great percentage of women and children living on the streets today became homeless because of domestic violence.

We've all wondered why people stay in abusive relationships, but ending abuse is often complicated by emotional attachments, financial concerns, cultural or religious mores and family ties. People who are abused by their partner often do not want the relationship to end – they just want the violence to end. They worry about finances, the impact of separation on their children, how friends and family members will react and even if their report of abuse will be taken seriously. They fear being judged as an unfit parent, or they don't want to burden their family and friends by asking for help. Under the best circumstances, it is not easy to end a relationship with an intimate partner. Love, family, shared experiences and memories form bonds that are hard to break.

And leaving does not always end the violence. Victims must be aware that threats and violence may escalate, resulting in more harm to the victim, children, friends, family members - even pets. There may be continued harassment, stalking, verbal and emotional attacks, especially if court ordered visitation is unsupervised or poorly supervised. Though "breaking up the family" is obviously the wise thing to do when staying jeopardizes physical, mental and emotional well-being, it certainly creates issues for children that may warrant counseling.

Ending a relationship is hard for everyone involved, just as domestic abuse affects everyone involved. To find out how you can make a difference and for additional information about domestic violence, call the Family Advocacy Program at 706-626-2614.
