- c. 5. Panel Report:

- a. COL Cox stated Fort Benning's Facebook town hall is 6 Dec 1800 through 1930. All garrison directorates will be present to address questions. He requested support from the Fort Benning community to identify things that make life better on Fort Benning. All Interactive Comment Evaluations that include contact information receive a response. Key garrison concerns are life, health, and safety. There are no asbestos safety concerns at the Commissary.
- b. DES: LTC Settles provided the holiday access control point operating hours, and emphasized safety while shopping and at home. Families leaving the area for Christmas may submit applications for quarters checks. Applications are at each housing office. During this time of year, driving under the influence, domestic violence, and larcenies increase.
- c. MACH: COL Bonds introduced LTC Doreene Aguayo, Chief of Pharmacy. The pharmacy's peak hours are 1000 to 1500. Efforts to expedite filling prescriptions are in process. MACH will close at 1130 on 15 Dec, all day 25 26 Dec and 1 2 Jan 18. The emergency room will remain open 24 hours per day.

- f. AAFES: Mr. Sydlik reported the main store renovation will be complete next week. The mini-mall renovation is nearing completion.
- g. DFMWR: Mr. Gelineau said DFMWR has discount tickets for Callaway Gardens and 180 free tickets for the 17 Dec showing of Tuna Christmas at the Springer Opera House. Call Tickets and Travel at 706-626-7644 for discounts and tickets. Tickets are first-come first-served. DFMWR received 800 Christmas trees to give to military Families at Weatherby Field. Families must show their ID card to get a free tree. Childcare is available for CARE meetings, Community Spouses Club, and Saturday shopping. For information about childcare, call 706-545-2079. The New Year's Eve Gala at the Benning Club is canceled. For refunds call 706-682-0640.


ACP 2 (Benning BLVD) will remain open with normal hours (0600 – 1800) except for Christmas Eve and Christmas, when the ACP will close at 1200 on 24 DEC 17 and will reopen at 0600 on 26 DEC 17.

ACP 3 (1-185) will remain open at all times.

ACP 5A (Sand Hill) will be close completely during the holidays starting at 1700 on 19 DEC 17 until 0500 on 2 Jan 18.

ACP 7 (Harmony Church) will close all normal inbound lanes except for the truck inspection lane at 1200 on 19 Dec 17. All vehicles will use the truck lane to enter the installation from 19 DEC 17 to 2 Jan 18. The ACP will close for Christmas Eve and Christmas, at 1800 on 24 DEC 17 and will reopen at 0600 on 26 DEC 17.

ACP 8 (Eddy Bridge) will remain open at all times.



As you deck the halls this holiday season, be fire smart. A small fire that spreads to a Christmas tree can grow large very quickly.

❖Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents

or lights. Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.

Use lights that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use. *Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water daily.

*Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.

Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.





If you're enrolled in TRICARE Prime, TRICARE Prime Remote or TRICARE Young Adult-Prime in the U.S., follow these guidelines when traveling:

If Traveling in the United States

- 1. Get all your routine care before traveling
- 2. If you need emergency care, go to an emergency room or call 911
 - o Call your primary care manager (PCM) or regional contractor within 24 hours
- 3. If you need urgent care, call your PCM, as you may need a referral.
 - The <u>Urgent Care Pilot Program</u> began on May 23, 2016. This pilot allows you to get two urgent care referrals per fiscal year without a referral from your PCM.

If Traveling Overseas

- 1. Get all routine care before traveling.
- 2. If you need emergency care, go the nearest emergency facility. To find a provider:
 - Search online or call International SOS.
 - Before you leave the facility, contact International SOS Medical Assistance:
 - Eurasia-Africa: +44-20-8762-8133
 - Latin America & Canada: 1-215-942-8320
 - Pacific (Sydney): +65-6338-9277
 - Pacific (Singapore): +61-2-9273-2760
 - If you're admitted, International SOS will coordinate with the facility for payment, determine whether you should be transferred to another facility and coordinate emergency transport, if needed.
- 3. If you need urgent care, call your PCM, as you may need a referral.
 - The <u>Urgent Care Pilot Program</u> began on May 23, 2016. This pilot allows you to get two urgent care referrals per fiscal year without a referral from your PCM.
 - To find a provider overseas:
 - Search <u>online</u> or call <u>International SOS</u>
 - Keep a copy of all your receipts, overseas claims require proof of payment.
 - You may need to pay up front and file a claim for reimbursement.

Need Prescriptions When Traveling?

We recommend that you get your prescriptions filled before you travel, but if you need a one filled while traveling you can:

- Fill the prescription at the <u>military pharmacy</u> if one is nearby.
 - Call the pharmacy first to see if they have your prescription
- Find the closest network pharmacy.
 - Available in the U.S. and U.S. Territories
 - If a network pharmacy isn't available, visit a non-network pharmacy.
- Home delivery isn't recommended for a prescription you need right away. If you're taking a long vacation, you can arrange for any regular prescriptions to be filled via home delivery.

FORT LEE, Va. – The holiday season is a busy time of year, with enough deadlines, preparations and celebrations to tax even the most organized among us. That's why the Defense Commissary Agency is informing its patrons now that the Fisher House Foundation's Scholarships for Military Children program will begin accepting applications for the 2018-2019 school year on Dec. 15.

liaison for the scholarship program. While applications will be accepted until mid-February, Dobson said that applying will require some time and effort on the part of families and students. "There are some fundamental eligibility and paperwork requirements, plus a student-authored essay to be written."

Now entering its 18th year, the program was created to recognize the "contributions of military families to the readiness of the fighting force and to celebrate the role of the commissary in the military family community," according to the mission statement on the militaryscholar.org website.

At least one scholarship worth \$2,000 will be awarded at every commissary location where qualified applications are received. Additional recipients will be selected on a prorated basis, so more scholarships will be awarded at those stores with larger numbers of applicants. A total of 700 scholarship grants will be awarded this year. Since its beginning, the program has awarded a total of 10,114 grants worth \$16.7 million to the sons and daughters of commissary patrons.


To qualify for consideration, applicants must be a dependent, unmarried child, younger than 21 — or 23, if enrolled as a full-time student at a college or university — of a service member on active duty, a Reserve or Guard member, retiree or survivor of a military member who died while on active duty, or survivor of a retiree.

Applicants should ensure that they and their sponsor are enrolled in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) database and have a military ID card. The applicant must attend or plan to attend an accredited college or university, full time, in the fall of 2018 or be enrolled in studies designed to transfer to a four-year program. Additional information, including the application itself as well as the question for the required essay, will be available when the program opens for the year at www.militaryscholar.org.

Applications must be hand-delivered or shipped via the U.S. Postal Service or other delivery methods to the commissary where the applicant's family normally shops. Applications cannot be emailed or faxed.

Fisher House Foundation, a nonprofit organization that helps service members and their families, administers the program. Scholarship Managers, a national, nonprofit, scholarship management services organization, manages and awards the scholarships.

"Interest in the scholarship program has increased in recent years, making the competition very keen," said Jim Weiskopf, Fisher House Foundation vice president. 


