



TERRELL ALDRIDGE CYS Sports & fitness Assistant



SAVES WEEK 2019 is fast

approaching! Every year, military installations and organizations around the world join forces to motivate and support service members and military families to save money, reduce debt and build wealth through a week of financial education. Since 2007, more than 200,000 savers have accepted the challenge of Military Saves Week. When they sign the Military Saves Pledge, they commit to exercise good financial habits, improve financial readiness, and encourage other Americans to do the same.

"I will help myself by saving money, reducing debt, and building wealth over time. I will help my family and my country by encouraging other Americans to build wealth, not debt."

Military Saves encourages all service members, their families, and civilian employees to "Set a Goal. Make a Plan. Save Automatically."

STEP 1: SET A GOAL

Goals are important. When you decide what you're saving for, you set limits on your spending, you decide where you will spend money and where you won't spend money. When you save for a down payment on a car, you establish that you won't spend your savings on a new TV. When you take the Military Saves Pledge, you identify a savings goal. The most common goals are saving for a rainy day with an emergency fund and saving for retirement. If you have another goal, that's great. Commit to it! Decide what is important to you and take action.

STEP 2: MAKE A PLAN

To take action, you must save money, and this may be the most difficult part of the challenge, because finding money to save can seem daunting. It's there in your paycheck, but it competes with other priorities, including the essentials, like housing, transportation and food. You must add savings to your short list of essential expenditures. Create a budget, or a spending plan, for your

assign every dollar of your paycheck to a

category. By including savings in your monthly budget, you commit to paying one very important bill to yourself!

STEP 3: SAVE AUTOMATICALLY

The Military Saves Week 2019 campaign encourages savers to "Make Savings Automatic." Here are four ways you can set it and forget it:

- · Contribute to the Thrift Savings Plan, and have a portion of your paycheck automatically transferred to your retirement account. Other employer retirement plans offer a similar option. Simply decide how much you want to contribute each month to meet your savings goal.
- Set up allotments via myPay. Designate an amount to go to an account that is separate from your regular checking account, preferably a savings account.
- Set up regular transfers using your financial institution's bill pay system. Automatically transfer money from a checking account to a separate savings account each payday.
- A tax refund is a great way to save. Use Form 8888, Allocation of Refund, to deposit your refund automatically in as many as three different accounts. Make sure one is a savings account. Visit SaveYourRefund.com to learn how saving at least \$50 of your tax refund could win you \$30,000 in prizes this year!

Background

The Department of Defense has conducted four military-wide surveys, in 2009, 2011, 2014, and again in 2016, to assess customer satisfaction with Morale, Welfare and Recreation services, activities and facilities. Feedback from active duty, National Guard and Reserve Component members helps to determine satisfaction with programs, areas in need of improvement and how and where to allocate funding.
