



WHAT IS BOSS?

Better Opportunities for Single Soldiers (BOSS) was initiated in 1989 for the more than half of all US Soldiers who are single. The program welcomes all Soldiers, all ranks and ages, as well as authorized MWR patrons, including civilians.

COMPONENTS OF BOSS:

Quality of Life/Well Being: This includes issues that influence the morale, living environment or growth and development of Soldiers. Examples include problems in living quarters, parking, PX/commissary issues and concerns about utilities, such as telephone or cable service.

Community Service: Activities are planned with on- and off-post agencies. Many programs ask us to provide volunteer support for their projects, which have proven to be worthwhile for everyone involved. Soldiers acknowledge that volunteering makes a noticeable difference in their lives and the lives of others. All community service projects provide the opportunity to increase awareness about the BOSS program while demonstrating the outstanding character of BOSS Soldiers.

Recreation and Leisure: Ideas for trips and events are planned and supported by BOSS Soldiers and coordinated through the BOSS advisor and president. They must receive military and civilian chain of command approval. Money raised through BOSS fundraisers often pays for a portion of expenses associated with activities.



MILITARY SPOUSE APPRECIATION DAY

On Military Spouse Appreciation Day, we honor the contributions and sacrifices made by military spouses. President Ronald Reagan recognized the profound importance of spousal commitment to the readiness and well-being of military members with Proclamation 5184, dated April 17, 1984. Congress made Military Spouse Appreciation Day part of National Military Appreciation Month in 1999, and the Department of Defense standardized the date by declaring the Friday before Mother's Day every year as Military Spouse Appreciation Day.

To show our gratitude to the spouses who hold down the fort for their Soldier and families, ACS will host a **Game Night from 5-9pm May 9** at the Supper Club for the spouses of active duty and retired service members. FINANCIAL READINESS PROGRAM (FRP)

Was your tax refund this year less than you expected? According to the IRS, the average tax refund was down 8 percent. The 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA) reduced taxes for most households and it reduced the amount employers withhold from your pay for federal taxes. State tax withholdings are not impacted. States that mandate withholding estimated taxes still use marital status and number of exemptions you file on your state W-4 or MyPay. The federal government uses a different system.

Some taxpayers use their federal tax return as a savings program or to pay down debt. Most financial planners discourage this practice. There is a better way to accomplish the same goal, at less cost to you. For information on how to effectively pay off debt and save more money all year long instead of waiting for tax season, call 706-545-4043 to schedule an appointment with an ACS Financial Readiness counselor.


POOP HAPPENS... BUT PICK IT UP!






5K FUN RUN SERIES




