5. Community Forum:

a. Army Community Service – Ms. Yoselin Doyle highlighted that volunteering allows individuals to learn new skills, enhances social networks, increases social solidarity, and increases connections within the Army community. The Volunteer Management Information System (VMIS) is the Army's system of record for managing volunteer service, awards, training, duties, and certificates. Volunteers can search for over 1,000 new volunteer opportunities at Fort Benning using VMIS. Volunteers must first register in VMIS to access all information and training databases. The 2023 Fort Benning Volunteer Recognition Ceremony will occur in April. To qualify and be recognized for your outstanding volunteer contributions, volunteers must have all their hours accrued in 2022 in VMIS and certified by your organization's Point of Contact by 30 December 2022. b. Georgia Department of Labor (GDOL) – Ms. Kenyetta Davis, local Veterans Employment Representative, briefed that she works with employers to market veterans' knowledge, skills and abilities while promoting the value veterans can bring to the workplace. Her primary function is conducting employer outreach and assisting veterans and their Family members to find meaningful employment opportunities. Mr. Frederick Merine, Disabled Veterans Outreach Program Specialist, briefed that his primary function is to provide intensive services to only eligible veterans or persons with a Significant Barrier to Employment (SBE). Special disabled and other disabled veterans receive prioritization. Spouses and dependent children of disabled veterans with a 100 percent disability rating are qualified to receive Veteran Employment assistance. c. Transition Assistance Program (TAP) - Mr. Wiley Motley, Transition Service Specialist, briefed that the Army's TAP is located at 8150 Marne Road, Building 9230, next to the Commissary. Its mission is to provide information and training to ensure transitioning Soldiers, Department of the Army Civilians, retirees, Soldiers' Family

members, and caregivers prepare for their next step. The TAP provides over 300 daily available job postings on its website to assist with spousal employment. These include resources in local, regional, national, and international locations. The TAP will resume inperson reconnection job fair events with local employers late January 2023. Ms. Niesha Owens, Career Skills Program Coordinator, briefed that the CSP affords transitioning service members the opportunity to participate in employment skills training, on-the-job training, pre-apprenticeships, and internships with a high probability of employment in high-demand and highly-skills jobs. Participation must occur within the last 180 days of military service, with an honorable discharge. For more information, visit https://www.benning.army.mil/garrison/dhr/TAP/Job-Announcements.html.

d. DODEA Military Family Life Counselor (MFLC) – Mr. Freddie Wilson briefed that the MFLC program started in 2004 with the First Armor Division's redeployment to Germany after returning from Iraq. The MFLCs are now in all service branches, including the National Guard, Reserves, DoDEA Schools, and CYB programs. Their mission is to provide Non-Medical Brief Solution Counseling to service members and their Families. The MFLC services are free and confidential, with a few exceptions including mention of self-harm, child abuse or neglect, sexual assault, domestic violence, or any illegal activity. The MFLCs are not restricted reporters like the Chaplain, Family Advocacy Program (FAP), or Sexual Assault Response Coordinator. People are tracked in the system if they receive support from Social Work Services, FAP, or Behavioral Health. The MFLCs are available to assist Families during the holiday season with relationship issues, conflict resolution, parenting, deployment stress and sadness, grief, or loss. 6. Panel Updates:

a. Directorate of Emergency Services (DES) – Mr. Kevin Clarke highlighted some holiday safety tips for units and Families. For units, have emergency numbers readily available. Expect increased number of absent without leave and desertions during the holiday season; keep an updated information packet for each Soldier. Prepare for an increase in positive urinalysis after the holidays. Suicides increase over the holidays; identify your high-risk Soldiers and ensure that you maintain good contact throughout the holiday season. For Families, request MP conduct quarters check when departing the area; notify MPs of your return to quarters. Large displays of holiday gifts should be hidden from your home's windows and doors. Refrain from placing high value refuse curbside to tell everyone what was purchased. As you drive the roadways, be aware of increased deer presence.
