1	<p>Speeding that occurs on the hill going down Baker St.</p> <p>I have two autistic children. Housing refuses to put chains on my do to ensure my children are safe. (They are prone to escaping no matter what we do) submitted paper work for autistic child sign six months ago. Nothing has been done. I contact housing about speeding and they say call the MPs. They also do nothing. No one is going to can until a child gets hit. Villages of Benning are responsible. They failed to give us an ada home and now they are failing the safety of children.</p>	<p>For the Housing portion of this, we are in the process of doing the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. We are partnering with DES to perform speed studies in each neighborhood. DES has increased presence in the neighborhoods that have reported speeding issues. After the Speed Study is completed, the Villages of Benning adds stop signs and Children at Play signs as recommended.</li><li>2. Speed bumps are not necessarily an option, as this would slow down emergency vehicles.</li><li>3. For any resident who need special signage, the resident just needs to ask their Village Office and signage will be ordered and installed. We have done this for both autistic child signage and deaf child signage.</li></ol>	<p>DES Police Division is conducting Speed Surveys in all of the Villages on the installation. The results of those surveys are analyzed and discussed in a Working Group (WG) consisting of other agencies/partners on the installation. Recommendations that comply with Federal Law and Army Regulatory guidelines are made to the Garrison Commander for consideration. Once the recommendations are approved, they are implemented in order to assist in making our communities Safer at Benning. Police will continue to provide pro-active actions to deter/stop those violating the Traffic Laws.</p>	<p>Closed</p> <p>Combined with like issues.</p>
