- If you have completed an online application previously, you will need to login with the Username and Password. This information is located in the middle section of the page under the heading 'I already have a Recruit & Hire account with Muscookee County Schools'.

(If you have forgotten your logon information, you may click on "I forgot my /Username or Password" to reset. This is located at the bottom of the middle column.)

New Mental Health Hotline

- The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline can now be reached by calling 988, a new three-digit phone code. Beginning July 16, 2022, this dialing code will be accessible to everyone in the United States.
- When people dial, text, or chat 988, the three-digit number automatically links them to trained counselors who are part of the current National Suicide Prevention Lifeline Network.



Please note: The current lifeline phone number (1-800-273-8255) will always remain available to people in emotional distress or suicidal crisis, even after 988 is launched nationally.

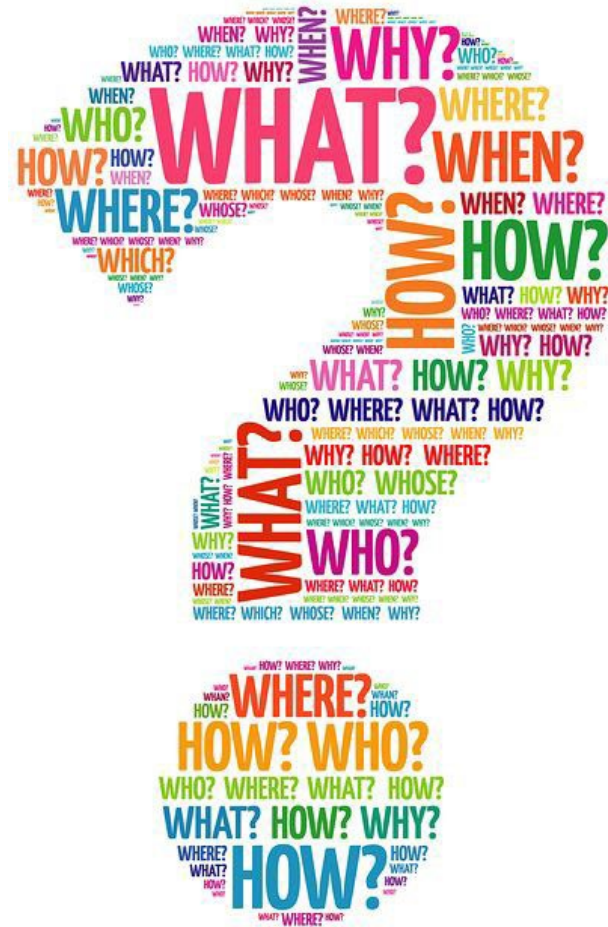

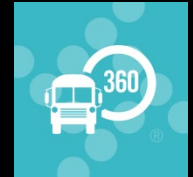

TRAVERSA RIDE 360



If your student is a bus rider you may now track the location of your bus via the Traversa App!



Download Ride 360

- **Download the Traversa Ride 360 App** to your device from the App Store
- Open the app to find your school, search for **Chattahoochee County**
- Once you have selected Chattahoochee County Schools you will be presented with the log on screen. Click **“Register”**
- To Register you will **enter your email address** that will receive messages from Traversa Ride 360. Enter an email that is often looked at.
- Next, **create a username and password.**
- After registering you will receive an **email confirmation.**
- **Confirm your email** before your student's account is registered.

Register Your Student

- Once you have registered, open the app. To add your student's name, select the **My Students** option by selecting the +(plus) icon in the top right corner of your screen. This will present the Find a Student screen.
- Enter your **student's GTID (10-digit ID from PowerSchool)**
- After you enter the student's GTID, you will **enter their first and last name as it is listed in PowerSchool.** To add another student, select the +(plus) icon in the top right corner of your screen and repeat.

Follow the Bus

- Once you have added all of your students, **view their transportation information.** Each student will have a separate login icon.
- **Click on My Students** to display the following information: school, bus number, bus route number, bus stop location and the pick-up/drop off time.
- **Click on My Bus Stops** to follow the bus, live via GPS. Please note that there is a 60 second delay between the GPS and cell device.
